The school received £69050 Pupil Premium allocation. The allocation will support staffing costs to ensure high quality and frequency of teaching and learning, and targeted support and intervention throughout the school day related directly to Communication and Interaction; Sensory and Physical; Cognition and Learning; Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs following a challenging and unprecedented year for children. School's Pastoral and Safeguarding Manager continues to work with teachers to support mental wellbeing, teaching and learning, providing specialist support to the teacher and support staff, and assisting pupils and their families in ensuring that they receive appropriate help to overcome barriers to learning both inside and outside the school, in order to achieve their full potential and narrow gaps in learning.
